Module 1: Assessing Client Capacity

Embody a community social worker on a home visit for an at-risk adult. Using foundational knowledge of the Five Domains of Well-Being, identify environmental red-flags, make choices to conduct an effective interview, and evaluate the client's decision-making capacity.

Learning Objectives

- Recognize environmental red flags which may indicate a level of need beyond what the client reports.
- Gain confidence in establishing rapport during a home visit.
- Recognize areas of concern and offer solutions based on an understanding of community resources.

Discussion Questions

- 1. What did you learn from assessing the outside of Rosie's home?
- 2. How did you feel when you first met Rosie?
 - a. Why did you feel that way?
- 3. Did any of Rosie's answers surprise you?
 - a. Which ones?
 - b. Did these answers influence your assessment of her decision making capacity?
- 4. Did Rosie exhibit signs of depression, delirium, or a cognitive disorder?
 - a. Explain why or why not.

Module 2: Risk Assessment

Embody Natalie, a social worker visiting the home of a former client in response to a hotline call from a concerned neighbor regarding suspicious activity at the home. Learners must critically evaluate the situation and make decisions which prioritize safety for all parties. After completing the visit, learners must report the level of perceived risk.

Learning Objectives

- Gain confidence in evaluating and navigating potentially unsafe situations to prioritize safety for all parties.
- Recognize how communication and approach can escalate or diffuse a situation.
- Use active listening skills to identify signs of a cognitive deficit disorder and understand how this impacts safety.
- Develop strategies for establishing a safe space and building trust.

Discussion Questions

- 1. What did you observe about the exterior and interior environments?
 - a. How does this differ from the exterior/interior in Assessing Client Capacity?
- 2. How did you feel when you first met Jesus?
 - a. Why did you feel that way?
 - b. What are some reasons you would choose not to enter a home?
- 3. Who did you choose to speak with and why?
 - a. Did any of their answers surprise you? Why?
 - b. Did these answers influence your assessment of the situation?
- 4. Did Rosie exhibit signs of depression, delirium, or a cognitive disorder? Why?
- 5. What do you feel should be prioritized to ensure safety and minimize risk for Rosie?

The doctor has diagnosed her with Vascular Dementia and probable mixed dementia.



Jesus Perez "Chuy" is Rosie's son. He was recently released from prison after being incarcerated for gang-related activity. Chuy has taken over care for his mom following the death of his sister, Maria. He loves his mom, but struggles to successfully provide care now that Rosie's cognition has declined.

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
